differentiated book it has a historical context with research of the time the poems of jonathan swift by jonathan swift jonathan swift dublin november 30 1667 ibid october 19 1745 was an irish satirical writer his main work is gulliver s travels which constitutes one of the most bitter and at the same time satirical criticisms that have been written against society and the human condition a member of the scriblerus club he anonymously published or used the pseudonyms of lemuel gulliver isaac bickerstaff and m b drapier to hide his satires of english parents a modest lawyer and a housewife jonathan swift was born in dublin and was a posthumous son of his father since he died shortly before he was born all he owed to the charity of his uncle godwin who was in charge of educating the boy in the midst of great poverty since his mother left the boy and returned to england his family was related to numerous writers especially his cousin john dryden who died in 1700 and the former francis godwin 1562 1633 and further and collaterally with walter raleigh and william davenant even so of all these only a utopian and satirical writer like francis godwin left some mark on his work he learned to read at age three and liked to do it out loud especially snippets from plutarch

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a modest proposal for preventing the children of poor people from being a burthen to their parents or country and for making them beneficial to the publick commonly referred to as a modest proposal is a juvenalian satirical essay written and published anonymously by jonathan swift in 1729 the essay suggests that the impoverished irish might ease their economic troubles by selling their children as food for rich gentlemen and ladies this satirical hyperbole mocked heartless attitudes towards the poor as well as british policy toward the irish in general the primary target of swift s satire was the rationalism of modern economics and the growth of rationalistic modes of thinking in modern life at the expense of more traditional human values

gulliver s travels is a satire by anglo irish writer and clergyman jonathan swift that is both a satire on human nature and a parody of the travellers tales literary subgenre it is swift s best known full length work and a classic of english literature the authorjonathan swift 30 november 1667 19 october 1745 was an anglo irish satirist essayist political pamphleteer first for the whigs then for the tories poet and cleric who became dean of st patrick s cathedral dublin

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
